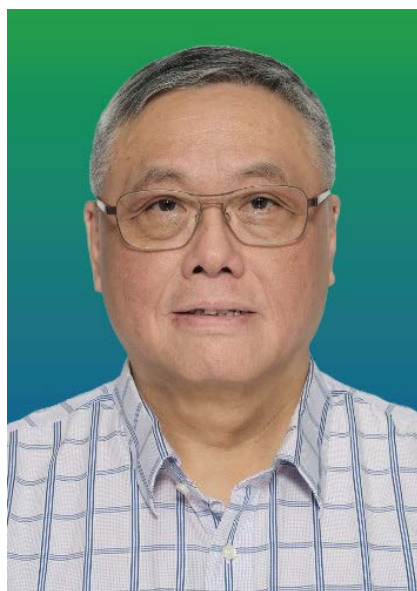

ABOUT HONG KONG

HONG KONG is a vibrant Special Administrative Region of China located on the country's southern coast, centered around the iconic Victoria Harbour with a population of approximately 7.5 million. Originally a collection of fishing villages and salt pans, Hong Kong became a British colony in 1841 and served as a vital strategic outpost until its 1997 handover to China. Because of its location at the crossroads of East and West, it developed into one of the world's most significant financial hubs and a premier gateway for global trade. To this day, the city's deep-water port ensures its position as an essential transit route for international maritime

logistics. Hong Kong's history is reflected in its architecture, which is a dense mix of colonial-era heritage buildings, traditional Chinese temples, and more skyscrapers than any other city on earth. Historically, Hong Kong has been a melting pot of cultures and backgrounds, resulting in a unique blend of Cantonese traditions and Western influences. Notable tourist destinations include Victoria Peak, the Tian Tan Buddha, the bustling markets of Mong Kok, the Star Ferry, and the neon-lit streets of Central. The climate in Hong Kong is humid subtropical, mostly ranging from 26 to 34 °C in summer.

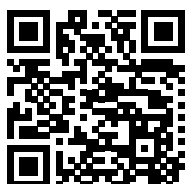


FIE SPORT MEDICINE CONFERENCE

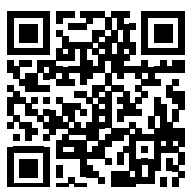

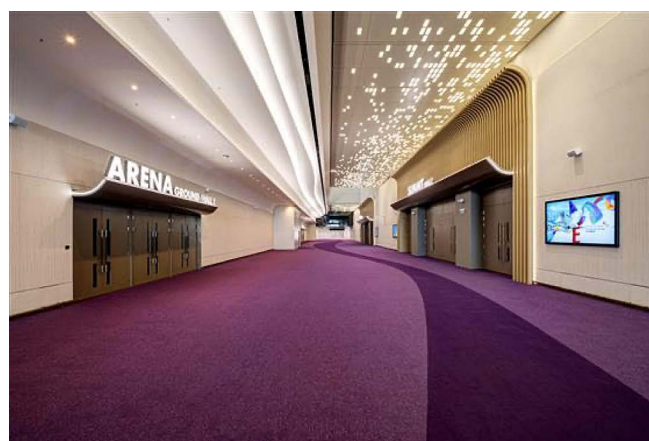

MASCOT

MAX FOR FOIL — DEFENSIVE TIMING WITH PRECISE OFFENSE

The hedgehog represents foil's signature balance: fast reactions, smart protection, and defensive "curl-up" moments that create openings. In foil, defense isn't passive—it's the key that allows clean, accurate touches.

OLLIE FOR EPEE — STEADY STRENGTH AND CONTROLLED DECISIONS

The oryx symbolise the calm power behind Epee. Its stand-your-ground presence reflects how Epee fencers manage distance, stay composed under pressure, and choose offense with intention. Defense supports the bout by holding the line until the right opportunity appears.

FINN FOR SABRE — SPEED, MOMENTUM, AND BOLD INITIATIVE

The swordfish captures sabre's fast, aggressive rhythm. Built for striking quickly, it represents attacking with momentum and taking the initiative in rapid exchanges. Defense still matters, but the mascot's energy highlights sabre as offense in motion—cutting forward when the opening is there.
